BARRINGTON, NH—Save Our Groundwater (SOG), a regional citizens' action group advocating that water is a natural resource to be held in the public trust and to be protected now and for the future, will host a Public Forum with Congressman, Dennis Kucinich on February 18, at 8:00.m. at the Sugar Shack on Route 4 in Barrington. Attendees are encouraged to arrive promptly at 8:00 a.m. Coffee and donuts will be provided.

Congressman and Presidential candidate, Dennis Kucinich of Ohio, will listen to citizen concerns about groundwater issues and the proposed water bottling plant in the seacoast and respond to the issues raised at the Forum.

Congressman Kucinich requested to speak with SOG members and guests once he became aware of the USA Springs, Inc groundwater issue through two SOG members when he spoke with them at his talk in Wells, ME last fall. Representative Kucinich has championed the cause of many communities and organizations during his long tenure as a US Congressman. He identified his interest through his capacity as Chairman of the House Domestic Policy Subcommittee which is a part of the Government Oversight Committee. The Government Oversight Committee has jurisdiction over the Department of Justice, the Environmental Protection Agency, the Department of Transportation and the Department of the Interior.

The forum is free and open to the public. The Sugar Shack is located one-half mile west of the Lee traffic circle.

Save Our Groundwater is a nonprofit, nonpartisan citizen action group which believes that the conservation and wise use of water is a topic of concern to all.
